By working through each section, you'll gain a deeper, more strategic understanding of the issue and how it sits within the wider policy landscape—providing a solid foundation for your research going forward.

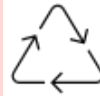
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What exactly is the problem you aim to address – and how is it currently framed? Is it clearly a problem statement, or is it actually a solution in disguise?



What are potential root causes? Think beyond the symptoms: what systemic, political, economic, or social drivers are at play?



Where in the policy cycle does your issue currently sit? How might this influence your approach?



Who is affected by the problem and what do they need or expect?



Who holds power or influence over this issue –and what motivates them?



What evidence or knowledge do you already have?



Blind spots: Where are the knowledge gaps? What needs further investigation to better understand the issue or inform action?



So what – why bother? What would change if this problem were addressed? What's at stake?
